Snow Emergency Still in Effect for City of Lafayette

LAFAYETTE, INDIANA – February 15, 2021 – Mayor Tony Roswarski has announced that the **Snow Emergency** for the City of Lafayette is still in effect through Tuesday, February 16.

“We are still expecting snow throughout this evening and early tomorrow morning,” states Mayor Roswarski. “We ask all citizens to remove their vehicles from the city streets that are marked Snow Emergency Routes through tomorrow morning so crews can clear the city streets.”

During a Snow Emergency, residents are required to move their vehicles from marked Snow Emergency Routes within 12 hours of a Snow Emergency declaration which was made on Sunday, February 14 at 8:00 pm. Failure to remove vehicles during the Snow Emergency may result in fines and towing. The City is also asking that residents and businesses move vehicles off all streets throughout the city as much as possible to assist in snow removal.
